THE SHOW MUST GO ON

Andrea Gilson was determined to make that happen for Notre Dame Academy's musical this year. Since there wasn't a script designed to work around the limitations of performing during the COVID-19 pandemic, Gilson decided to write one about the reality her students were facing. The original work called, "The Show's Online," is appropriately named for the times we are living in, but ultimately gave Notre Dame students the opportunity to come together to create a special performance.

"The show is about a group of students that find out that their musical is being canceled," said Gilson, who is the co-director of Notre Dame's musical. "The show itself mirrors the present situation they're in and there are a lot of parallels between their lives today and the script."

"The Show's Online" was filmed in February and was available for viewing online from March 20-April 3 using AnywhereSeat.com. All of the musical numbers were recorded by a professional film and sound crew in Notre Dame's auditorium with a live pit orchestra directed by Steve Johnson, NDA band director.

"It was important for us to have a live pit orchestra," Gilson said. "During COVID times, a lot of pit orchestras are pre-recorded, but it was important for us to have the live pit orchestra be a part of the production."

Meanwhile, all but one of the acting scenes were recorded using Zoom to mimic the digital channel many people have used to communicate and maintain social distancing within the past year.

"It was very different," Notre Dame junior Molly Kukiela said. "In a regular musical, we're usually working the scenes lots of times, but we didn't have as much time this year with each other as a group."

Scheduling and carrying out the recording of performances was a tall task. The students had to adjust to wearing clear masks while singing on stage and had to perform their part multiple times in a row to ensure the audio and visuals were correct.

"It was very strange having the last songs we recorded," said Christine Salerno, a co-director of the musical. "I think we did it like six times because nobody really wanted it to end."

In addition to the audio and video equipment, obtaining the copyrights for songs was another expense for the musical. It's why Salerno created an original song to help offset those costs for showing the musical online this year. Students also got to provide creative input to the musical as juniors Abby Elfner and Skylar Schultz wrote and rewrote some of the scenes from the script, which Gilson originally drafted during Christmas break.

"We found ways to work together collaboratively" Gilson said, "and rise above the challenges to produce something completely fresh and original, and it really reflects all of the students' stories."

Senior Owen Campbell edited all of the footage to produce the final video.

"We wanted to embrace his talents and utilize his talents," Gilson said. "Not having the finality of it all can be a little nerve-racking because you want to see the finished product, and it's also exciting because it's also something else to look forward to because it's not completely done."

Dr. Lulloff holds vital role in fight against COVID-19

Dr. Sarah Lulloff is an impactful woman. From her role as a practicing physician in infectious disease to her position as Medical Director of Infection Prevention for Hospital Sisters Health System (HSHS) Eastern Wisconsin, the 1987 Saint Joseph Academy alumna has played a vital role for the Green Bay area throughout the COVID-19 pandemic.

"It's been a whirlwind, really," she said. "There've been a lot of late nights and a lot of early mornings."

Lulloff's career journey began on the West Coast, where in her early years as an undergraduate at Stanford University she wasn't sure what field she would ultimately pursue.

"I think what I like about infectious disease was the investigative piece of it," said Lulloff, who got her master's degree in epidemiology at the University of Wisconsin before going on to the Medical College of Wisconsin. "I've always liked the dynamic nature of a career where things change a lot and where I would have to do a lot of keeping up."

As a student in the late 1980s, well within America's AIDS crisis, Lulloff was able to see the impact of the devastating disease face to face. She learned from a variety of experts outside of the medical field, from public health to activists. She said, "It was kind of fascinating and got me excited about the field of infectious disease and potentially public health."

You get to kind of dabble in lots of different facets of medicine," she explained, "You have to understand antibiotics and the pharmacology side of things, as well as the microbiology stuff."

When COVID-19 started to surface in other countries, Lulloff and her team at HSHS were charged with a slew of tasks to keep the hospital running. From developing visitor policies to obtaining personal protective equipment to just answering questions, the group was instrumental in keeping HSHS ready to help.

"It's been just humbling to understand the resources that have been required to keep our colleagues, our healthcare workers, safe," she said. "Our medical teams and nursing teams have just done a phenomenal job, especially during the months of late September, October, November, December when we had the surge of COVID in this area."

"I certainly hope that we don't have to repeat that ever again. It's been devastating to understand the impact of the illness on families, on individuals in our community."

Lulloff applauds all healthcare workers and hospital personnel for their dedication to the communities they serve during the COVID-19 pandemic. She is thankful to have the opportunity to work with them and do her part, which wouldn't have been possible without the educators and doctors that made an impact on her life while at SJA, college and medical school.

"There were a handful of teachers that definitely encouraged me to believe in myself and to strive to seek out challenges and to reach far," she said. "I still know those teachers' names, they were influential and I'm grateful for that."

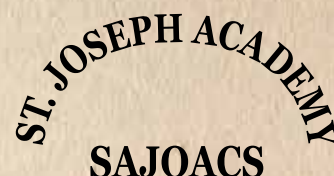

ABBOT PENNINGS ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Stanton follows 'simple recipe' to raise money for charities

Great times for great causes. That's the formula for success behind Mel's Charities, according to Tom "Mel" Stanton, who founded the nonprofit in 1999.

The 1979 Abbot Pennings graduate has seen Mel's Charities become one of Southeast Wisconsin's largest charity organizations and touching countless lives in the process.

Mel's Charities has donated a total of \$1.4 million in 22 years to their Ozaukee County community and will break ground this summer on a 100-acre mixed-use living community in Saukville, a move Stanton calls a "game changer for so many."

Now, Mel's Charities has far exceeded the reach of one man, but it still owes its roots to a bowling alley, a group of friends and the grace of God.

"It really was through the grace of God. It didn't start out as a charity. It was really my wife and I and our friends having a party. ... A really good friend of mine sister had passed away, a single mom with a special needs daughter. God really hit me over the head and said, 'You know, you big idiot, why aren't you doing something to help someone else?' It was spur of the moment. ... We raised \$350, and we gave it in her memory to Ozaukee County Special Olympics."

Here, the vision for Mel's Charities was born. Stanton recalled, "I tried to do it myself, trying to navigate this crazy life. ... I finally came to the realization that the Holy Spirit was working through me. That's when it really hit me that we could do something special here through the grace of God and just have fun. We're never changing that. Just have fun and impact lives every day."

What began as an annual pig roast and small fundraiser has ballooned to an entire calendar of signature events. Stanton said, "It's been my whole life for the last 20 some years. To be able to wake up every morning and empower, engage, and impact people and have fun, instead of thinking about yourself all the time ... it's a pretty simple recipe."

Stanton's charity work is centered around his local community, particularly intellectual and developmental disability (IDD) individuals, human service organizations, mainly dealing with drug, mental health, and food insecurity issues, and establishing me-

morial scholarships at high schools in memory of young victims of tragedies, such as car accidents and drug overdoses.

"We're all battling something. We try to help in those areas to bring some joy and some funding that's needed," he said.

As for his time at Pennings, it's where Stanton's foundation was established. "(Teachers) always were there to encourage and to keep looking out for you. ... It built a foundation," he said.

For Stanton, the relationships built at Pennings were lifelong. "I still say it's all about relationships. I still have so many best friends from high school. They live all over the country and they come in for events. They fly in, especially for the pig roast, even 40 years later."

Jewell drumming up support for others

David Jewell started playing the drums when he was in fifth grade. The percussion instrument has been a fixture in his life ever since.

The 1976 Premontre graduate kept a steady beat as a performer in his younger years before eventually finding his true rhythm in life is helping people beat difficult circumstances.

"I would have never dreamed that something like this would have happened," said Jewell, who has worked for the Yamaha Corporation of America – one of the world's biggest producers of drums – for 23 years in several different roles.

Jewell lives in Anaheim Hills, Calif., and oversees the philanthropic arm of the company, Yamaha Cares.

It's a natural fit for Jewell, who has helped raised over \$200,000 in 13 years through Katrina Kures, which is a fundraiser his family founded a couple years after his daughter was diagnosed with Type 1 diabetes.

"It got me going. It really kind of spurred something in me," he said. After starting out as a series of charity runs, Katrina Kures has evolved to the point where Children's Hospital of Orange County has a donation bucket in it specifically for the cause with all the funds going towards diabetes research. Meanwhile, Katrina has become a phlebotomist with the hospital.

"I want to find a cure in my lifetime," said Jewell, who started working for Yamaha as a product manager following 14 years of working at a music store in Scottsdale, Ariz.

His position with Yamaha has taken him to Japan, Indonesia, Taiwan, China and Germany. He estimates also traveling to about 40 of the 50 states in the U.S.

The shift from working in product development to working with philanthropic efforts led to Jewell advocating for music education in Washington, D.C., for eight years with the National Association for Music Education. In 2015, the

Every Student Succeeds Act was passed, making music and the arts considered part of a child's well-rounded education.

Through Yamaha Cares, Jewell gets to work with many other amazing organizations, including Guitars 4 Vets, which is based in Milwaukee.

Although he's lived most of his adult life on the West Coast, Jewell still holds true to his Wisconsin roots as a season ticket holder for the Packers.

The Ashwaubenon native can recall his mother, Madeline, teaching at Saint Joseph Academy and having parent-teacher conferences with Vince Lombardi, whose daughter was in her class.

Jewell is thankful for Mrs. Mandy, the band director at Valley View Elementary, who gave him the chance to play the drums and ultimately open up a world of opportunities. Now, he's trying to pay it forward.

"It's a passion and it has been a passion all of my life," said Jewell, who still plays on a drum set in his garage. "My mindset is about doing the right thing and giving back. I've always been about that, but now I'm really putting pen to paper and really doing it."

Yerges driven to succeed

Many Notre Dame Academy alumni excel in their lives and careers following their high school education. Chris Yerges, a 2003 graduate, has raised the bar for excellence with his efforts around the race track.

Yerges is the lead race engineer for No. 34 car driven by Michael McDowell, who won the 2021 Daytona 500 on Feb. 14. Getting a car to the winner's circle in NASCAR's most famous race took a lot of hard work for the NDA alum.

The Green Bay native majored in mechanical engineering with a concentration on motorsports through the University of Wisconsin-Platteville. He later returned to UW-Platteville to earn his master's degree in motorsports engineering management. He recalls, "If I didn't get good grades and have the extracurricular activities, it would have been more difficult to get into a good engineering school. ... I definitely felt challenged academically at Notre Dame."

Yerges attributes his simulation work to an architecture class he took that helped grow his drafting skills to improve the car. His team's recent win at the Daytona 500 proved that he was right when he said, "I knew racing was what I wanted to do for a living," after his first year.

Yerges' passion for motorsports started when he began working at 141 Speedway in Francis Creek as a teenager. He eventually found himself in the driver's seat at local tracks before moving to North Carolina after graduating college. His transition from driver to engineer has ultimately spawned into 12 years working in NASCAR with drivers like Kyle Busch, Carl Edwards and Denny Hamlin.

He has worked at Front Row Motorsports since 2019 as a lead engineer, and his team finally brought home a coveted first-place trophy at Daytona this year. He said that starting in 17th place in NASCAR, the only thing he could do was to believe "anything

was possible" for the race outcome. He compared his team to the opponents and stated that his team "operates on a third of the budgets the larger teams" have at their disposal.

With the recent pandemic, Yerges has worked from home during races. In 2021, NASCAR decided to enforce roster limits to lower the number of people at each race for safety. Yerges' team has the technology and tools that allow him "to tap into data streams," and it helped him talk to the crewmates.

The Notre Dame Academy girls basketball team captured the WIAA Division 2 state championship on Feb. 27 at the La Crosse Center.

Notre Dame put together a dominating performance in the state semi-finals to upend Onalaska, 64-32. The Tritons later pulled away for a 68-56 win over Reedsburg to capture the D2 state title, which was the program's third state championship under the direction of Sara Rohde, who has won 201 games in 10 seasons as head coach.

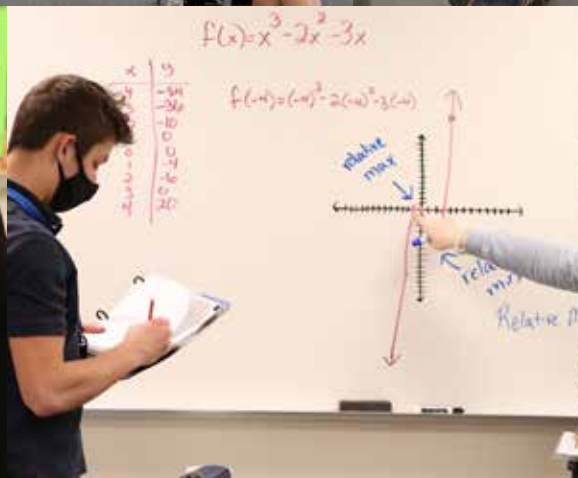

Teaching and Learning during a Pandemic

Diane Mulroney provides a burst of energy at the start of each of her classes.

The Spanish teacher greets her students with a vibrant “Hola!” as she spins a cart around with a laptop on it so the students joining the class via Zoom can see their peers in the classroom for a moment before she circles it back around to herself to begin the lesson.

Enlightening students that are directly in front of you while also engaging ones who are following along virtually has been the juggling act of the 2020-21 school year.

Watching Mulroney and all of the teachers at Notre Dame Academy pull this off is much like seeing a master chef in a busy kitchen mixing ingredients at a rapid pace for multiple orders and dishes.

There was no clear blueprint or template for how to handle education during a worldwide pandemic. The recipe for success has been a combination of adaptation, courage, flexibility and plenty of patience.

All of the classrooms at NDA were carefully measured and rearranged in preparation for this unique academic year to ensure each desk was placed at least six feet away from any other seat. Meanwhile, tape marks on the floor in front of a marker board provide an outline for the space teachers can instruct from. It’s an ironic visual because this year has required an enormous amount of outside-the-box thinking.

A wide array of digital tools have been a huge aid to educators, who have worked tirelessly to adjust to the fluid schedules that have become a way of life since the outbreak of COVID-19. You can see the effort on display everywhere in the building located at 610 Maryhill Drive in Green Bay.

For example, during the last week of the third quarter first-year teacher Megan McClay was using her prep period to go over math equations with a couple of students while directly across the hall Sue Nelson, one of the most tenured educators at NDA, was doing the same thing for two students in one of her science classes.

Although students today often have Chromebooks and digital tablets in their backpacks, it was comforting to see McClay and Nelson’s students still using the powerful and trusted tools of a pencil and paper.

Everyone longs for the days of when Zoom was a word better known as being a feature on a camera. It’s through photos that an outsider can truly appreciate what educators are accomplishing during these unprecedented times.

Nonverbal cues have been heightened since masks have covered one of the most precious and endearing things we all possess – a smile.

A smile is traditionally something students will unknowingly provide as confirmation that they are understanding the material being taught. The COVID-19 pandemic has stolen that emotional cue away. The rise of cheekbones and eyebrows provide a glimpse for teachers to know that there are in fact still smiles behind those masks.

Our talented and dedicated educators have faced and overcome a lot of obstacles in the past year. They wish everyone could witness the progress still being made each day by their students, and they can’t wait until they can share smiles with their students again.

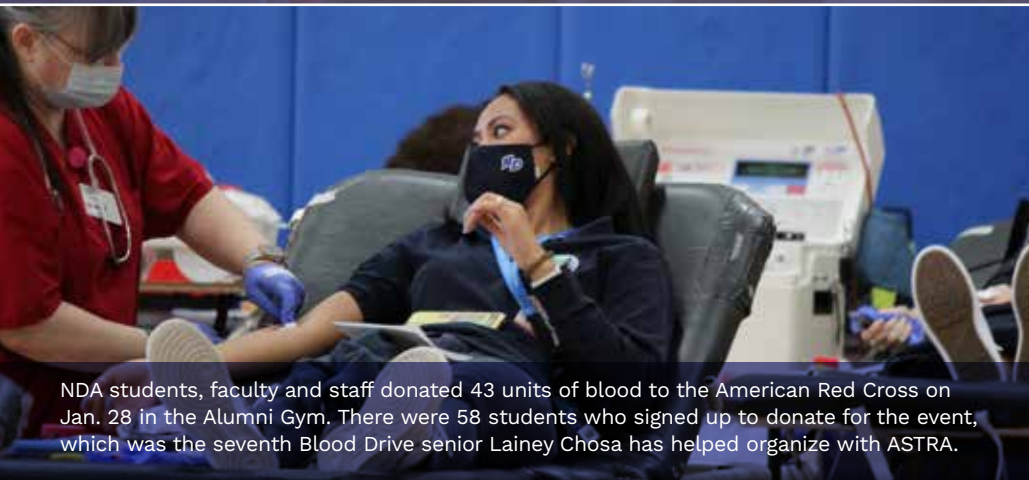
